The Auburn Police Department, in cooperation with the Gwinnett Metro Drug Task Force and the Department of Homeland Security, brought drug trafficking charges against a Hispanic female for possessing and transporting 3000 pills containing Fentanyl.



This bust also netted seven kilograms of Fentanyl which was recovered in Lawrenceville by utilizing information gleaned from our original traffic stop. All parties are to be commended for taking a substantial amount of an illegal substance off the street. There is no doubt that lives were saved by this effort.

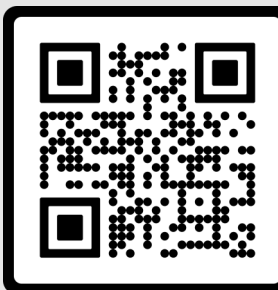
MAYOR'S CORNER

Building on the success of Auburn Fest this past weekend we are already planning and prepping our Christmas celebration and will have much more info in the coming weeks...

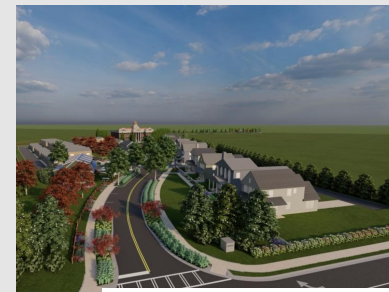


Progress in Auburn

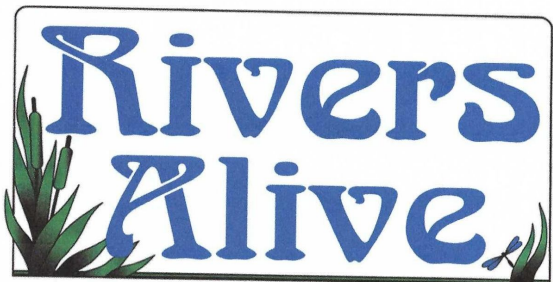

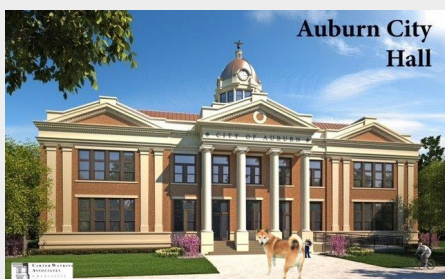

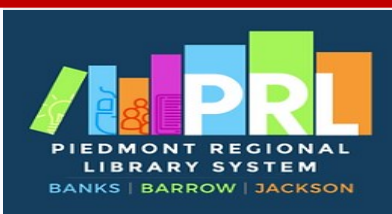
