Rain Gardens or Buffer Zones: It's all about stormwater runoff.

Stormwater Runoff comes from rain falling on lawns, patios and driveways or from rooftops (especially gutter downspouts) and storm drains. Once the water flows or volume exceeds the absorption ability of the surrounding vegetation, it can drain directly into the our streams. This runoff water often carries bird or animal feces, insecticides, fertilizers and other pollutants which may enter the streams without any type of filtration.

The Solution is simple..... add a Buffer Zone or Rain Garden to absorb rain water flow and runoff.

The Mayor's Corner

August is here and so are the dog-days of summer. For the City of Auburn, this is not a time of relaxation. On the contrary, we are busy in our budget review season getting the FY 2018 budget ready. Each year Auburn elected officials and city staff roll up their sleeves to review revenues and expenditures of the previous year. This is a great time to evaluate where we are as a community and where we are headed. I am so pleased with what the City of Auburn has been able to accomplish. Over 35 projects are on our completed list! While it may not be easily seen since the projects are all over Auburn, I just wanted to highlight some of the things we have accomplished in the last year.

The first thing that comes to mind are our wonderful Whistlestop Shops. We completed eleven shops and a restroom in Whistlestop Park next to City Hall. These micro-retailing shops have drawn a lot of people downtown to shop and we couldn't be more pleased. There is a waiting list for shops that grows longer every day. You will find the most unique gifts, yummy treats and amazing crafts in your own downtown. Come out and take a stroll to see everything Auburn has to offer.

Whistlestop Shops are the most visible project that we completed but there are so many more that you may not have noticed. The 6th Street Park Phase I has been completed with the installation of the road and clearing of trees and brush. This park will feature walking trails along the stream and is the site of our future Dog Park.

The installation of our new Downtown Sound System was completed as well. We now have music playing downtown during the daytime hours. The great thing about this is we can also use it for our events. Now, instead of the visitors near the stage being blasted by loud music (so that it can be heard down the street), the music and announcements play at an even level throughout downtown. It also eliminates issues with sound during our monthly Movies in Whistlestop.

We write often about our Community Garden and have finished two phases in the past year which included the original The Caboose Museum Phase I has been completed including the installation of artifacts from the railroad. Phase II will

construction of the boxes and the addition of more boxes. Phase III will include the construction of a potting shed, a water feature and fencing. The beautiful arbor was also completed between Hue Graphics and the Police Department, providing a comfortable seating area downtown. This arbor also provides a great focal point for our events—serving as a photo opportunity for Elsa and Anna during Auburn Ever After and Santa's Reindeer during Sounding Off the Christmas Season. include climate control and repainting of the caboose exterior.

Not as visible, but even more important are the multiple infrastructure projects that we have completed. These include required GPS of all stormwater outfalls and catch basins as well as fire hydrants and street signs. These are state and federally mandated projects.

Our Public Works Department has worked on many needed projects including the extensive Greentree Water Line. This subdivision operated on a failing community well with poor water quality and pressure. Phase I has been completed with the installation of all new water lines that are hooked up to City water and all residents now have access to safe, reliable water.

There are many other projects large and small that your City is working on daily. Want to know more? Come sit in at a City Council meeting. Council meetings are held the 1st and 3rd Thursday of each month at 6:00 pm. We would love to see you there!

Important Notice—County-Wide Wastewater Rate Increase

Barrow County has notified us that a wastewater rate increase was passed by Barrow County. This increase will go in effect on water bills mailed in August (due September 15). Wastewater is determined by the number of gallons of water used in a household.

The current rate of \$15.60 will increase to \$15.90 for the first 2,000 gallons of water used and from \$3.27 to \$4.47 for each 1,000 gallons above 2,000.
