## Community Garden Update!

We are so pleased with the progress of the Auburn Community Garden. Designed to be installed in three phases, we have now completed the first two Phases. During Phase II, we took care of some of the technical things such as installing stormwater infrastructure and making sure the area drains well. The first ten planter boxes have been constructed. These boxes are 4x8' (exterior dimensions) and of varying height. We did the higher boxes to make it easier for those with physical limitations to participate. Several of the boxes will be designated as handicap accessible, with solid pavers around them rather than gravel. This will make wheelchair access much easier. The sod has been laid and additional evergreen trees were planted for screening. The irrigation is installed and we are getting closer to having these ready for public access. The Steering Committee has been busy this month to discussing bylaws, organizational procedures, and the elements of the next phase (Phase III).

We are very excited about Phase III. This phase will consist of constructing additional planter boxes, seating areas, pedestrian paths, and constructing potting/tool shed. This phase also calls for the planting of fruit bearing trees and bushes. The trees will be planted in groups with seating so not only will we have delicious fruit, we will have pleasant, shaded seating for our citizens to relax and enjoy the gardens. Part of the area in the community garden is reserved for an outdoor classroom where everyone—especially the children—can come and learn about gardening and the importance of this to our community, environment and overall wellbeing.

The entrance to the community garden will be between the Auburn Police Department and Hue Graphics on 4th Avenue. We will begin construction of the access to parking soon. This area will include a courtyard area that contains the stenciled sidewalks that give downtown so much of its personality.

The community garden has its own Facebook page, so please keep an eye on it for photos of our progress and updates on applications for spaces. The community garden will be a showcase for our City and we are very pleased with the progress our committee has made.

Your child must be 5 years of age on or before September 1st, 2016 to attend Kindergarten. Kindergarten Registration and concept screening will be conducted from 8:00 a.m. until 2:00 p.m., at the Professional Development Center, 179 W. Athens St. in Winder. Please plan to attend your school's scheduled registration day below.

Parents can go online, prior to their school's registration day, to Registration Gateway at https://registration.barrow.k12.ga.us to Pre-register their kindergarten child. Pre-registration can take place anywhere you have internet access, and at any time. Once the pre-registration process is complete, parents/guardians will need to bring their child for concept screening and the following documents to registration, where your child will receive an enrollment for school:

- Current proof of residency (dated within 30 days) such as a utility bill (electric, gas, water, cable/satellite,
- garbage or house phone), settlement statement or rental/lease agreement,
- Student's birth certificate (or legible copy of the Birth Certificate), or other acceptable proof of age and
- identity.
- A copy of the enrolling **student's Social Security card** (which is used solely for the purposes of identification and
- for application for the Hope scholarship and other post-secondary applications). Parents have the option of signing a
- Updated Georgia immunization form 3231, and
- New health form 3300- The Georgia Department of Public Health requires the completion of the 3300 health
- form which includes vision, hearing, dental and nutrition screenings, and must be presented to school

waiver stating that they do not wish at the time of enrollment to provide a Social Security number.

The water consumption rate increase that was passed on June 6, 2013 by Mayor and Council for the New Increases with Consumer Price Index for all Urban Consumers (CPI-U), effective on March 1st of each year, will go into effect on Water Bills Due by April 15, 2016 with an increase of 0.7%.

#### Clean Catch Basins Mean ... We Can All Weather This Storm!


What are catch basins and what do they do? Catch basins are the square grids that are placed along the curbs to collect water from our streets during storm events! They are the entryway from our streets to our storm water drainage system and represent the first step in storm water collection. On rainy days, rainwater and anything else on the streets enter our storm water drainage system through the catch basins. The City owns all the catch basins within the rights-of-way and is responsible for maintenance of these catch basins. If the catch basin is not within the street rights-of-way, it is considered to be on private property and should be maintained by that property owner.

How can you help keep catch basins flowing freely? The City of Auburn's Public Works crews clean catch basins However, with the City having to maintain many other areas, the need to have the crew in your neighborhood may not come as frequently as needed. Therefore, by helping to clean the catch basins in front of your house, you can greatly reduce the risk of a clogged drain during heavy rain events until the City crew can respond to your area.
