October is here already! It is time for the leaves to change and the weather to cool off. I know I have enjoyed the cooler temps and low humidity! Autumn also brings the fall wedding season. The Perry Rainey Center is booked solid with fall weddings! It is so gratifying to see that this historic building is now the part of so many new beginnings. Not only do we host events and weddings at the Perry Rainey Center, it is also the location for Lanier Tech's High School equivalency (GED), English as a Second Language (ESL) and Citizenship classes. Did you know that for the past 12 years, adult education classes have been available in the City of Auburn? Starting in 2009 with a grant from the Jackson EMC Foundation, GED classes were provided at Auburn Elementary, and then moved to the J.D. Withers building. When the Perry-Rainey Center opened in 2019, the adult education classes were given a permanent classroom. All classes are free of charge. Since its inception, we have had over 50 adults receive their GED through this program!

The GED class prepares adult students for the Science, Social Studies, Language Arts, and Math GED tests. Many of the GED graduates have gone on to college, received promotions at work, or gotten better paying jobs. Many of you do not know that I am also a GED graduate. Since then, I have earned my bachelor's degree and am also a published author. I had the honor of being named the GED recipient of the Year for the State of Georgia in 2018. As I can attest, earning a GED opens many doors, and can change the life not only of the graduate, but their family too.

The English as Second Language class began in 2018, and has helped students from all over the world learn to speak, read, and write in English. A major roadblock to assimilation into a new country is learning the language, and with the ESL classes, students feel more confident applying for jobs, talking to their children's teachers, and participating in the community. It also helps in the process to become a US citizen.




