Culvert Maintenance

Homeowners throughout the city are responsible in most cases for residential culvert maintenance and repair. Repairs can be costly, so its in your best interest to make sure your culvert is always properly maintained.

Natural Debris can fill a culvert up very quickly. Weeds, grass clippings, and leaves can clog your culvert up over time. These should never reduce water flow by 20% or more. Serious drainage issues can occur if they do.

If your culvert is near a public roadway, or another property. inspections and maintenance are key to avoiding flooding that could damage the roadway or other properties near you. Removing silt, trash, and vegetation should be a part of your culvert maintenance routine. Examine your culvert for any issues such as Deterioration, and Damage for soil erosion.

Pre-K Lottery Registration Open 3/1/22 to 3/31/22

The BCSS Pre-K Program will be accepting online applications for the 2022-2023 Pre-K Lottery starting March 1 at 8 a.m. until March 31 at 5 p.m. Please visit https://www.barrow.k12.ga.us/departments/teaching-learning/pre-k/pre-k-lottery or call 770-867-4527

To complete the lottery application, you will need to provide proof of residency and our child's birth certificate. You will need to upload a photo or scanned copy of each document. If you have problems with the Pre-K Lottery application, email Karen Bedford (karen.bedford@barrow.k12.ga.us) for assistance.

All online lottery applications must be completed by 5 p.m. Thursday, March 31, Free Estimates on New Installs! 2022. (This includes the successful upload of your documentation.) No Pre-K Lottery applications will be accepted after 5 p.m. If you miss the deadline, starting April 18 email Karen Bedford to have your child placed on the waiting

> list. All applications submitted for each Pre-K class will be assigned a lottery number. After you submit your online application, it may take up to two business days to receive your lottery number. Our staff must verify the information provided and then email you with your child's lottery number

Families with more than one child eligible for Pre-K will be assigned one number and the siblings will be drawn together. The lottery consists of random drawings from all applicants within that elementary school attendance zone.

With the wealth of experience just these three participants have, it will be exciting to see this garden's progress.

Some of the great things we have planned at the Community Garden include the Auburn library building a seed library for the community. Sunnie's Bees will be placing bee hives adjacent to the garden in a protected area. These bees will help with pollination and Angela will be adding some bee keeping classes and information to the schedule soon. We will be using herbs and other flowering plants to the periphery of the garden as not only landscaping but pollinators. The herbs such as rosemary, parsley, dill and more will be available for use throughout the year.
